## About the programme

Children in need of care and protection are handled by practitioners from varied professional backgrounds including but not limited to Magistrates, Police Officers, and Probation Officers. Others are the workers in charitable children institutions, statutory children institutions, counsellors and teachers. These practitioners lack specific training in child care and protection. Currently there are no known comprehensive and accredited child care and protection training programmes in Kenya. Pwani University in collaboration with the Association of Charitable Children Institutions of Kenya (ACCIK) therefore developed this curriculum to address this need.

The programme is expected to produce graduates who are ethical, creative, innovative, competent and accountable. It also aims at providing an opportunity for self development in relation to career and life-long learning. Further, the programme intends to provide holistic quality education as well as offer service to the student. It also seeks to equip the student with relevant Child Care and Protection knowledge, skills and attitudes.

## Vision, Mission and Philosophy of the Programme

The BA (CCP) Programme is designed to promote creativity, dynamism and to respond to the market demands and needs of the society on issues of children. The vision and mission as well as the philosophy of the programme are articulated in the subsequent subsections.

## Admission Requirements

To obtain admission into this course, an applicant must satisfy any of the following requirements:

- Be a holder of K.C.S.E certificate with a minimum aggregate of C+ or its equivalent qualification; **OR**
- Be a holder of Kenya Advanced Certificate of Education (K.A.C.E) certificate or its equivalent with a minimum of two principal passes and one subsidiary pass; **OR**
- Be a holder of a Diploma in a relevant field with a minimum of Credit or its equivalent, from an institution recognised by a relevant Accreditation body in the region.
